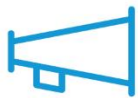

Connect your community.

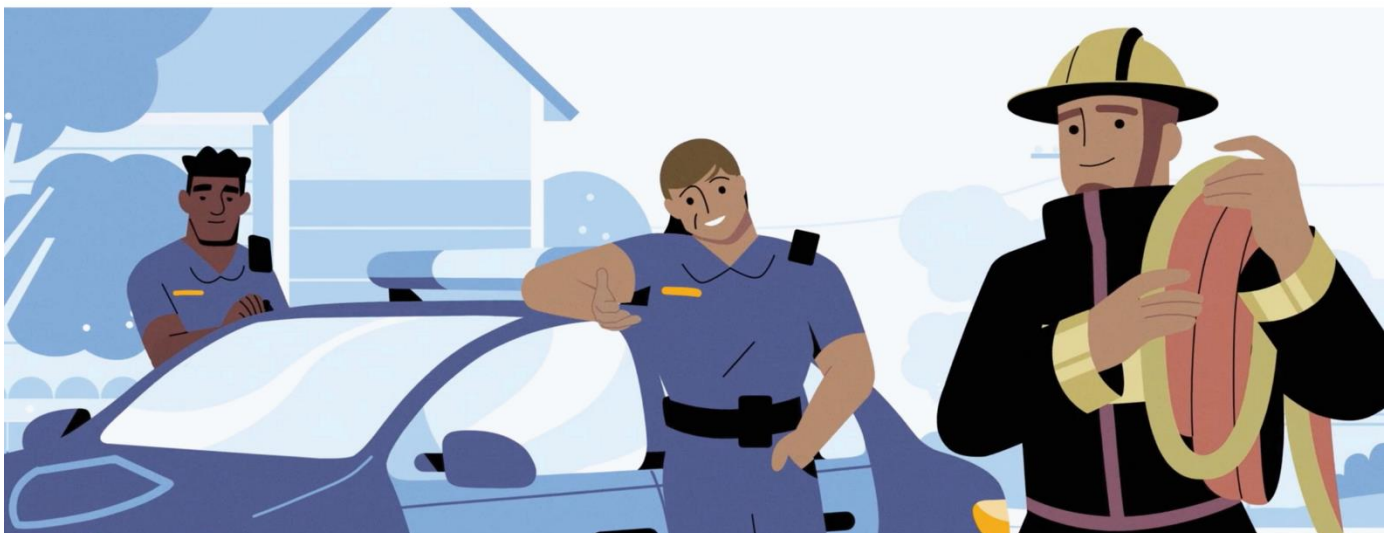
