## Informal Interpretation

## If this involves an actual situation, explain briefly:

We are completing a new commercial building. We have installed the stair handrails within the range of 34 " to 38 " to top of rail. However, along the run of the stairs, the handrails may vary from $371 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ at the top step to $36^{\prime \prime}$ at the bottom step as an example. NFPA 101 section 7.2.2.4.4 states the required range of 34 " to $38^{\prime \prime}$ only. However, our inspector has raised a concern and states this does not comply because it is not a uniform dimension.

Question (should be worded so that it can be answered with either "Yes" or "No"):
Is our current condition in compliance with the referenced code section?

## Answer:

Yes.
NFPA 101, 2006 7.2.2.4.1 allows for a variance from the top of tread (measurements from the leading edge of the tread) which shall not exceed 38 inches or be under 34 inches.
